ONE NATION UNDER GOD

Every time we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America we commit ourselves to "one nation, under God, indivisible."

WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR A NATION TO BE "UNDER GOD"?

It means that that nation is subject to the laws and judgments of Almighty God. No nation, however blessed or powerful, is a law unto itself. When, in domestic practice or foreign policy, it violates the will of God, it will be held accountable.

A nation "under God" will be preoccupied with questions of justice and righteousness. A nation "under God" will feed the hungry, clothe the naked, identify with the poor and alienated and oppressed. It will be concerned about private morality and public responsibility.

A nation "under God" will recognize that its own interests must be made subservient to global need and global reality. If the United States has a right to place its "national interest" above all else, then so do one hundred fifty other nations on the face of the earth. This philosophy legitimatizes the law of the jungle. It makes some form of international anarchy inevitable.

Today we are celebrating the two hundredth birthday of the United States of America. There is no better time to remember the words of the Psalmist:

Sing praises to God, sing praises! For God is king of all the earth;
God reigns over the nations; God sits on his holy throne.
For the shields of the earth belong to God;

he is highly exalted!
